Heavy Rainfall and Flash Flood Risk Expected through Thursday Morning

The Harris County Office of Homeland Security & Emergency Management (HCOHSEM) is monitoring a storm system that is expected to produce heavy rainfall conditions beginning Monday afternoon.

The [National Weather Service \(NWS\)](#) has issued a Flood Watch for Harris County and surrounding areas through Thursday morning. Rainfall amounts of 2-7 inches are possible, with some areas seeing higher totals. Potential impacts include flash flooding, hazardous travel conditions, and increased flood risk in areas with rivers, streams, and bayous.

Residents should remain weather aware and expect additional weather-related watches and warnings to be issued. **Have multiple ways to receive alerts and be ready to take action should conditions change quickly.**

- **Street flooding** is possible in areas where the heaviest rain falls. Before getting on the road, check the [Houston TranStar](#) live traffic map for information on road conditions.
- Drive with caution and **never** drive into flooded roadways. **TURN AROUND, DON'T DROWN.**
- **Monitor** media sources for severe weather information. Follow weather safety advice from the [National Weather Service](#) and other official sources.
- Short periods of **intense rainfall** can cause temporary rises along our network of streams and bayous. You can see real-time information on waterway conditions using the Harris County Flood Control District [Flood Warning System](#).

- Today is a good day to make sure that your mobile devices are set to receive **wireless emergency alerts**(WEA). NWS will use these alerts to warn residents in the path of potentially dangerous weather. WEA messages **save lives**. [Apple](#) | [Android](#)

Flash Flooding Likely

Key Messages

- Deep moisture, a stalled front and a passing disturbance will bring heavy rainfall through at least mid week.
- **Moderate Risk (level 3 of 4)** of Heavy Rainfall each day through Wednesday, mainly along the coast.
- Rainfall Rates: 2-4"/hr, up to 5"/hr possible.

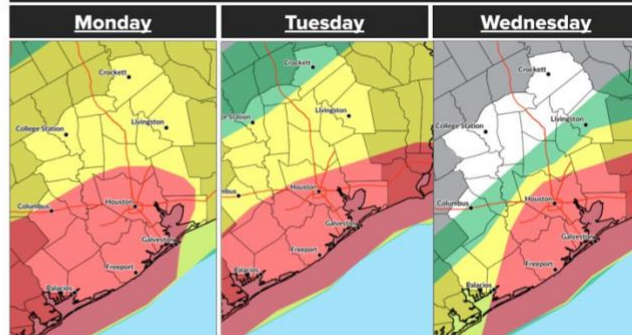
Potential Impacts

- Rises in rivers, creeks and streams.

Se esperan lluvias intensas y riesgo de inundaciones repentinas hasta el Jueves

La Oficina de Seguridad Nacional y Manejo de Emergencias del Condado de Harris (HCOHSEM) está monitoreando un sistema de tormentas que se espera produzca lluvias intensas a partir de la tarde del lunes.

El [Servicio Meteorológico Nacional \(NWS\)](https://www.weather.gov) ha emitido una Vigilancia de Inundaciones para el Condado de Harris y las áreas cercanas hasta la mañana del Jueves. Se esperan entre 2 y 7 pulgadas, con algunas zonas que podrían recibir cantidades mayores. Los posibles impactos incluyen inundaciones repentinas, condiciones peligrosas para viajar y un mayor riesgo de inundaciones en áreas cercanas a ríos, arroyos y bahías.

Se recomienda a los residentes mantenerse atentos a las condiciones meteorológicas y esperar la emisión de alertas y advertencias adicionales relacionadas con el tiempo. Tenga múltiples formas de recibir alertas y esté preparado para actuar si las condiciones cambian rápidamente.

- Períodos cortos de lluvia intensa pueden causar aumentos temporales en los niveles de agua de arroyos y bahías. Puede consultar información en tiempo real sobre las condiciones de las vías fluviales utilizando el [Sistema de Alerta de Inundaciones](https://www.harriscountyflod.com) del Distrito de Control de Inundaciones del Condado de Harris.
- Hoy es un buen día para verificar que sus dispositivos móviles estén configurados para recibir Alertas de Emergencia Inalámbricas (WEA). 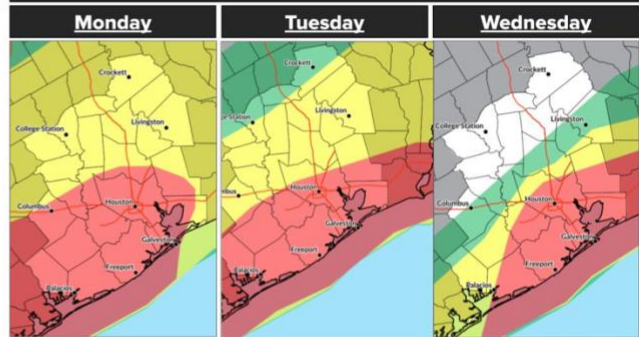
