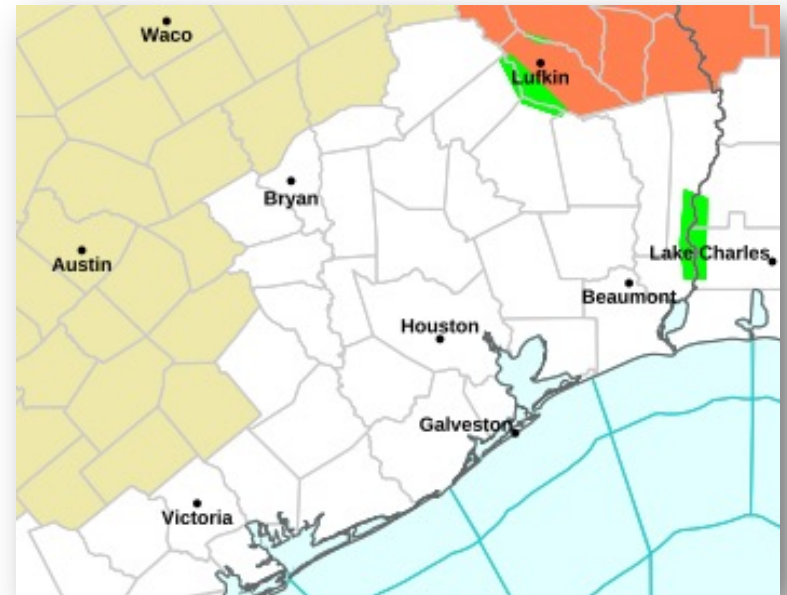

He is compiling a list for CenterPoint and will need your ***name, address, and phone number.***



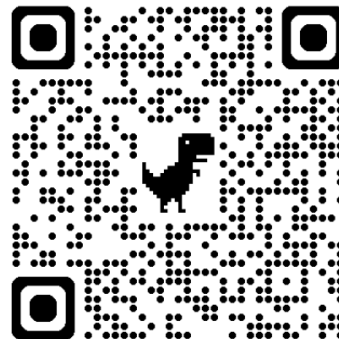

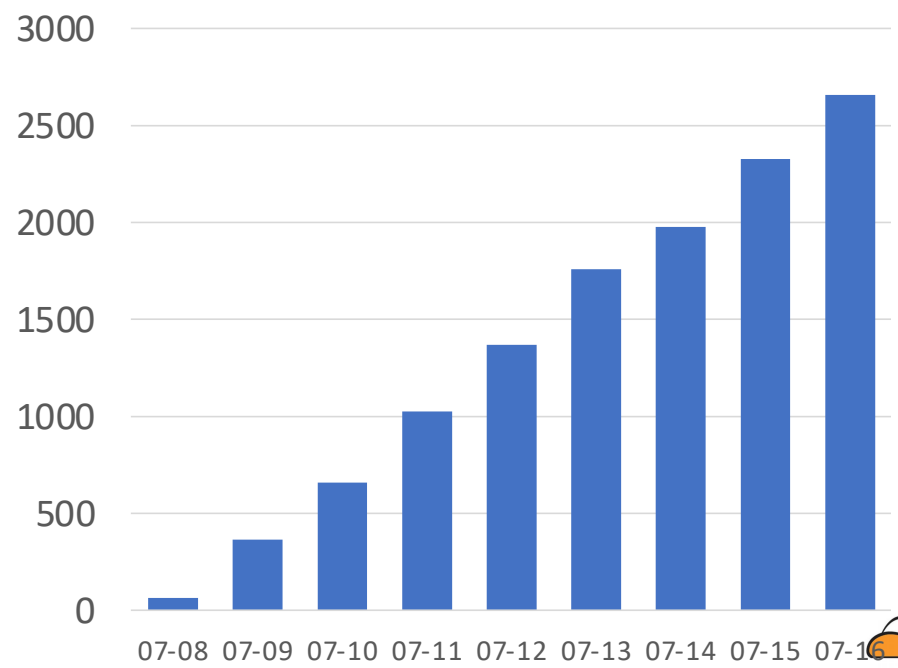


# Crisis Cleanup

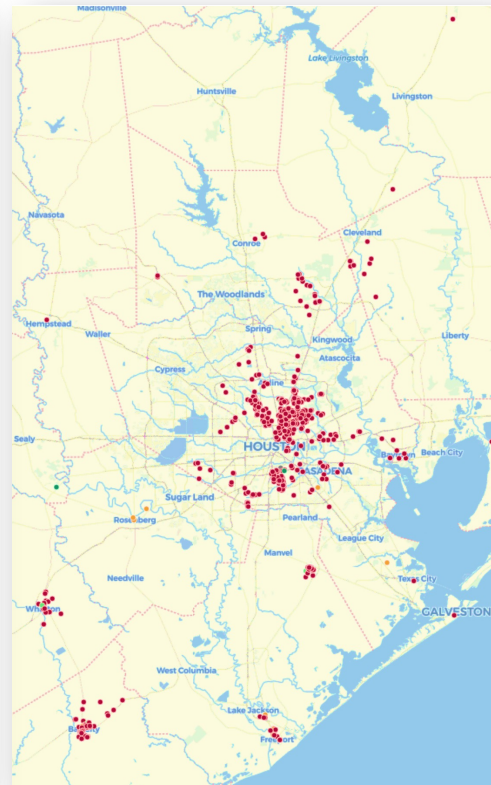
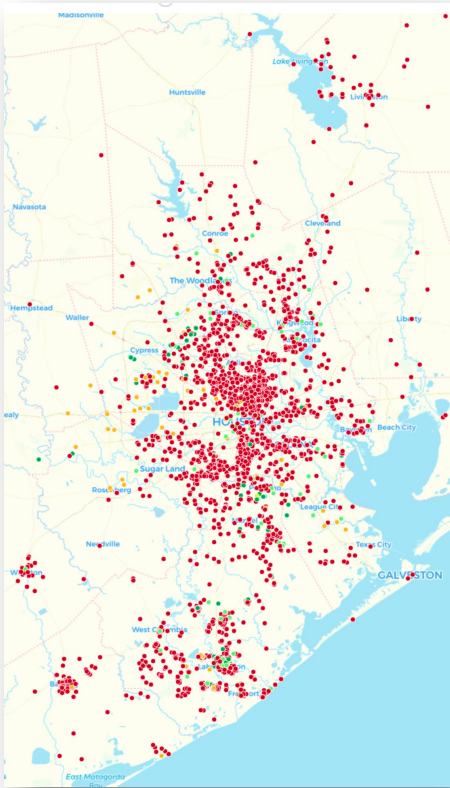
