



Another round of showers and thunderstorms is expected on a Thursday-Friday time period (mainly on Thursday and Thursday night) as the next disturbance moves through the area.

- Locally heavy rain is possible. Any heavy rain falling on already saturated grounds could lead to flooding.
- As of right now, the highest risk of excessive rainfall looks possible in areas around and north of I-10.
 - Estimated rainfall totals of 1 to 3 inches expected. Locally higher amounts possible north of I-10.

Soils remain very saturated, so quick responses to area rivers, creeks and bayous are possible.






Trinity River @ Liberty




Damage Assessment
