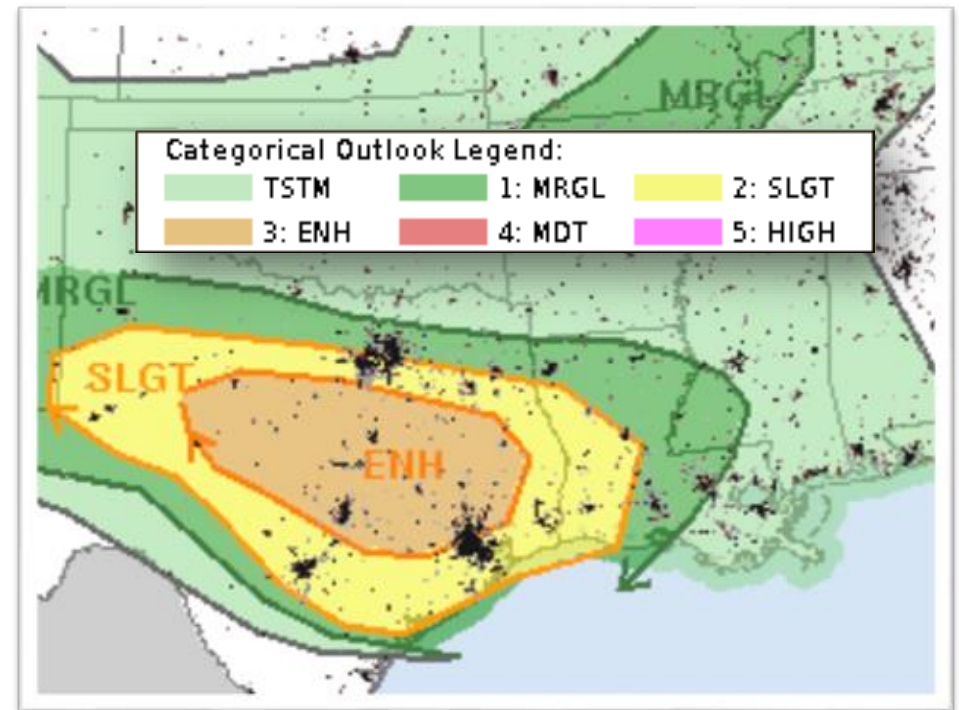




FLOOD WATCH

- Flooding caused by excessive rainfall will be possible.
- 2-4" of new rainfall is expected across areas north of the I-10 corridor.
- Locally higher amounts above 6" are possible.

IMPACTS AND ACTIONS

- Excessive runoff may result in flooding of rivers, creeks, streams, and other low-lying and flood-prone locations, particularly urban areas.
- Monitor latest forecast updates and be prepared.

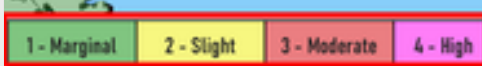

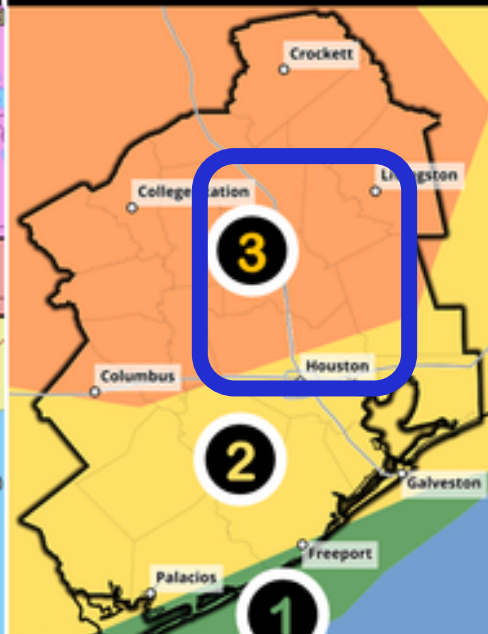


Hazardous Weather Outlook: Thurs/Thurs Night

WHAT

- Locally heavy rainfall could result in dangerous flash flooding.
 - **High risk** (level 4 of 4) exists mainly north thru east of the Huntsville area.
 - **Moderate risk** (level 3 of 4) exists mainly near and along a line from College Station to Conroe to Liberty.
 - **Slight risk** (level 2 of 4) exists for most of the rest of SE TX, except the Matagorda Bay area where there is a **Marginal risk** (level 1 of 4).
- Isolated to scattered strong to severe thunderstorms possible.
 - **Enhanced risk** (level 3 of 5) near and especially north of Interstate 10.
 - **Slight risk** (level 2 of 5) exists near and south of Interstate 10.
 - **Marginal risk** (level 1 of 5) exists near the immediate coast.



TIMING

- Periods of showers and storms, mainly Thursday afternoon thru Thursday evening.



IMPACTS

- Localized flash flooding is possible as well as additional rises along area rivers and creeks, especially where already saturated.
- Large hail and damaging wind gusts are the primary concerns. A brief, isolated tornado or two cannot be ruled out.

WHAT

- Locally heavy rainfall could result in flash flooding, especially in and around locations that received heavy rain on Thursday.
- Marginal risk** (level 1 of 4) exists generally near and to the east of a Lufkin to Cypress to Wharton to Palacios line.
- Isolated to scattered strong to severe thunderstorms possible.
- Marginal risk** (level 1 of 5) exists for much of SE TX, mainly to the east of the Brazos Valley.

TIMING

• Periods of showers and storms, mainly during the day on Friday.

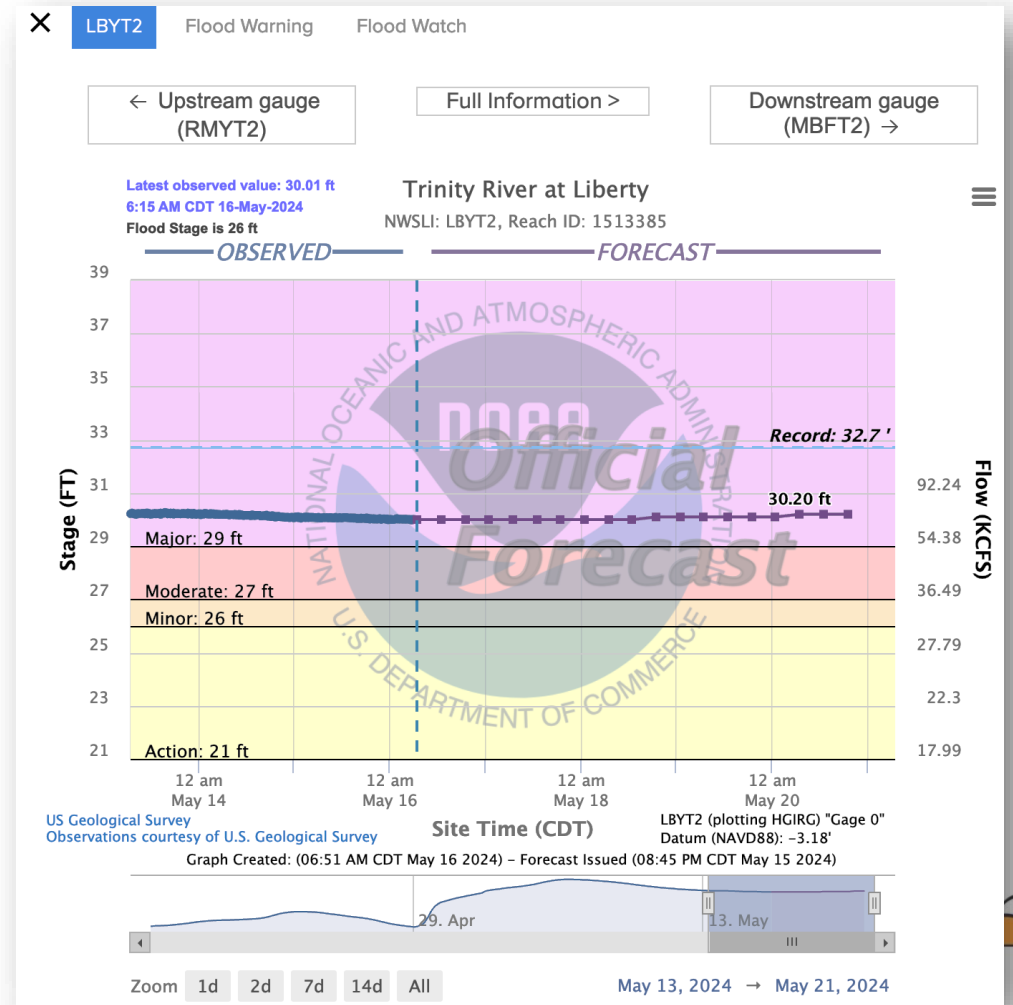
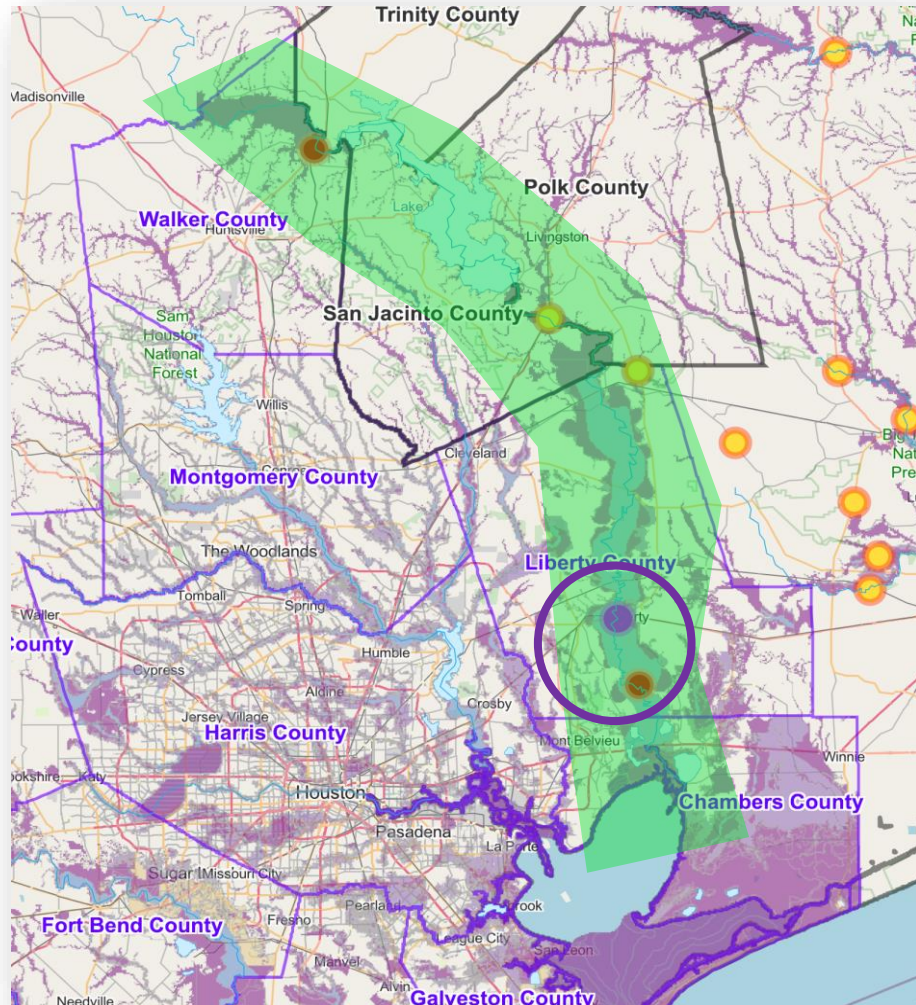
Trinity River @ Riverside (Moderate +)



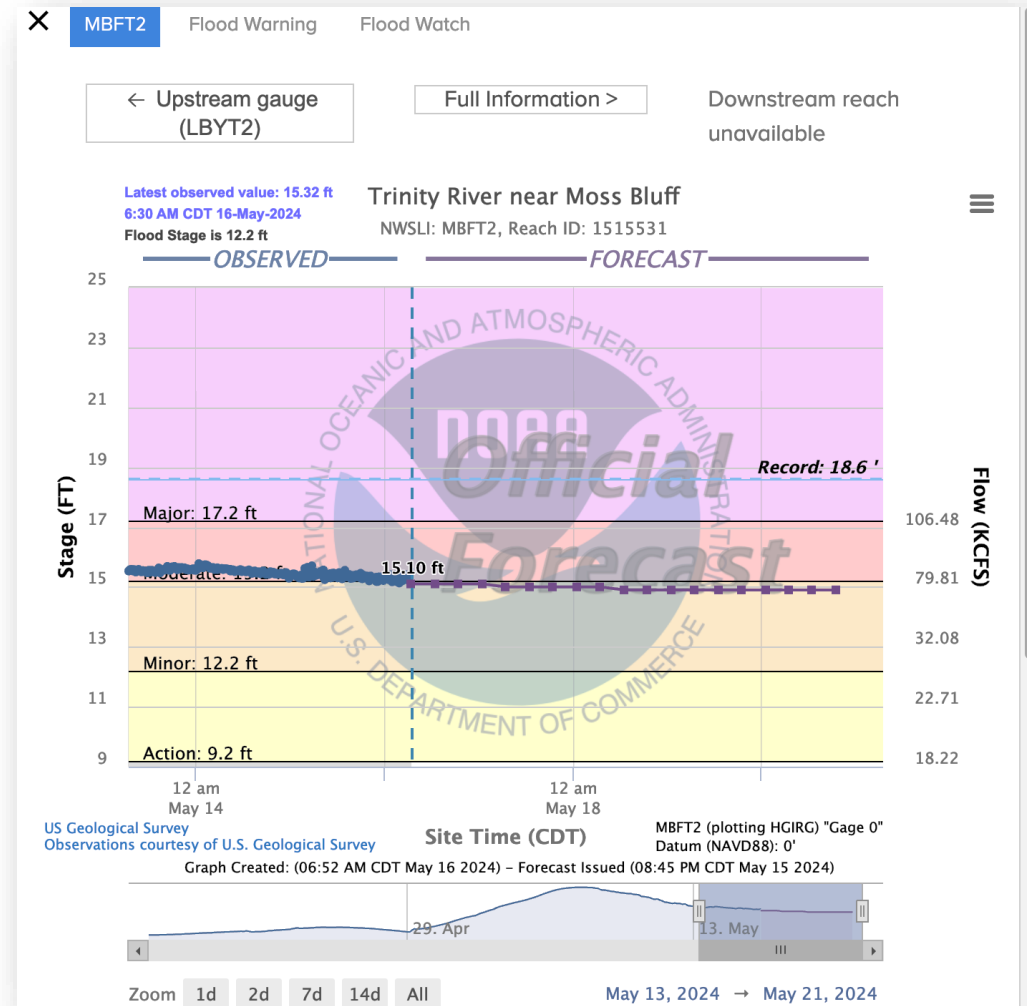
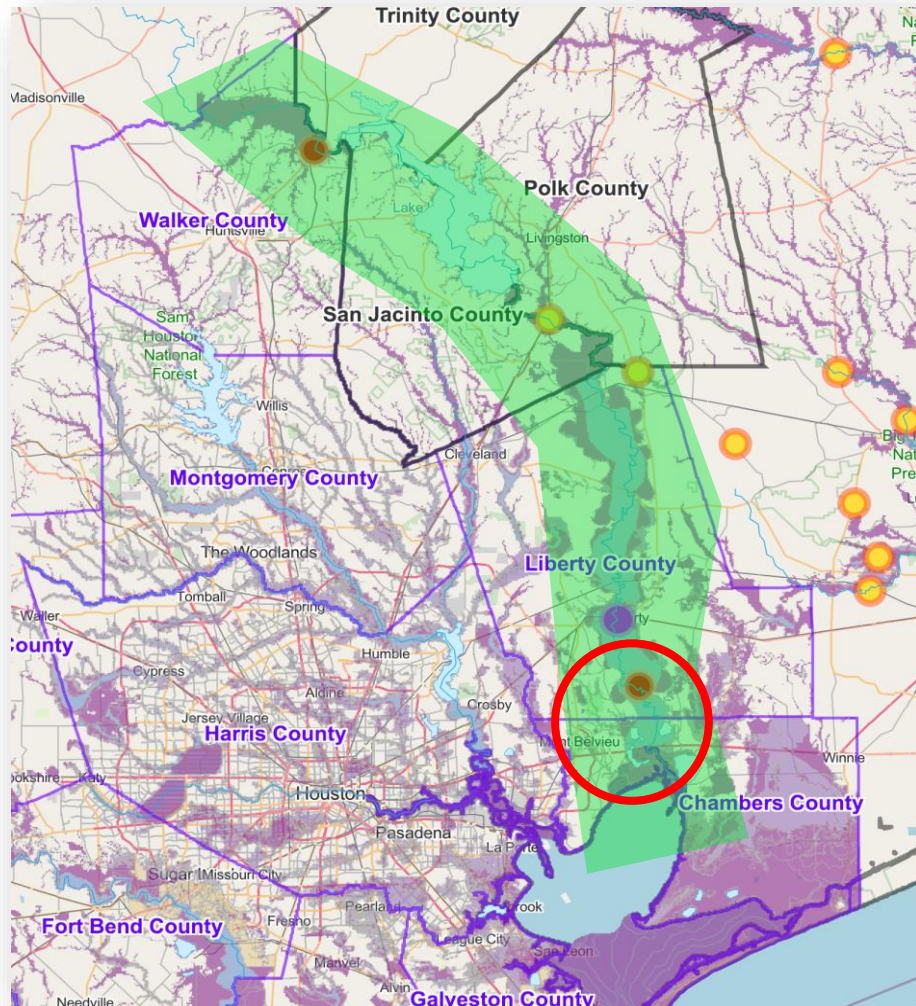
Trinity River @ Goodrich (Minor)
