**WHAT**


- There are multiple chances for strong to severe thunderstorms for SE Texas beginning today (**Marginal Risk** - level 1 of 5) and continuing through Friday (**Slight Risk** - level 2 of 5):
  - Isolated, pop-up storms this afternoon/evening
  - A line of strong to severe storms moving through the region late tonight into early Friday morning
  - Additional storms possible through Friday afternoon
- Exact timing and locations of the strong to severe storms is uncertain as they will be determined by small-scale features and interactions
- The storms that move through tonight, if strong enough, may reduce the threat of severe thunderstorms Friday afternoon

**IMPACTS**



- Damaging winds and hail will be the primary threat.
- An isolated tornado cannot be completely ruled out.
- Locally heavy rain will be possible with the stronger and/or slower moving storms.
