

Non-Perishable Food Items:

Nutritional snacks - granola bars, nuts, trail mix, dried fruits pull-top canned goods (veggies, fruits, soups, meats - tuna, chicken), MREs, cereal Water and shelf-stable drinks

Hygiene Products:

Soap, toothpaste, household and personal hygiene products

Easy-to-eat fruits ("hand fruits"): bananas, apples, oranges, pears, peaches, etc.

Baby Supplies:
Diapers and wipes

Bleach and Cleaning Supplies: for storm cleanup and sanitation




A shower or two around the area in the evening, then partly cloudy overnight. Low 77F. Winds SE at 10 to 15 mph. Chance of rain 40%.


Partly to mostly cloudy. Low near 75F. Winds SE at 5 to 10 mph.






Today's Outlook



For today, partly cloudy skies with afternoon showers and thunderstorms possible.




Severe Storms



Strong to severe thunderstorms will be possible through Friday capable of producing strong wind gusts, hail, and locally heavy rainfall.




Excessive Rainfall



Strong to severe thunderstorms will be possible through Friday capable of producing strong wind gusts, hail, and locally heavy rainfall...




Houston's HOT!





Trinity River Flooding (Charts not updated)




