At TGCRVOAD, we rely on <u>Crisis</u> <u>Cleanup</u> as our tool for managing work orders during a disaster response. We use it to help many people and families who require assistance with debris management, clean-out, mucking,



gutting, or tarping services. To make the most of this technology, it's important for us to understand how it works and use it as intended.

TGCRVOAD is currently providing training courses for Crisis Cleanup. With August and September approaching, it would be beneficial for your team to refresh their knowledge on how to utilize this platform.

ICS Training

The TGCRVOAD works together with Emergency Managers or the Office of Emergency Management to respond to disasters. In order to improve our communication, it is essential that we have a solid understanding of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS). FEMA provides online courses that we highly recommend taking during times of calm so that we can communicate more effectively during times of crisis.

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- ICS-100 Introduction to the Incident Command
 System: This course is designed for self-study and serves as an introduction to ICS. It lays the groundwork for more advanced ICS training and covers the system's history, features, principles, and organizational structure.
 Additionally, the course explores the relationship between ICS and NIMS.
- <u>IS-700 NIMS</u>, an <u>Introduction</u>: This course focuses on introducing the NIMS concept which aims to provide a uniform template for all government, private-sector, and nongovernmental organizations to collaborate efficiently during domestic incidents.
- ICS-200 Basic Incident Command System for Initial
 Response: This course is designed to help personnel
 operate effectively during an incident or event within the
 ICS. ICS-200 offers training and resources for personnel
 who may take on a supervisory role
